

## Program Learning Outcomes Annual Assessments

This document charts the completion of annual assessments of student achievement of program learning outcomes/goals within each of LPC's academic programs and the evidence these assessments provide concerning student learning.

Each year LPC faculty within their academic program committees conduct an annual assessment of program quality and student achievement of learning outcomes through evaluation of direct, indirect, and descriptive evidence guided by each program's Assessment Plan. Each committee assesses collected student work from the signature assignments connected to the learning outcome being evaluated that year. The faculty assess the work against the rubrics developed for evaluating the level at which the work shows students are meeting program outcomes, reporting and providing reflection upon the data as well as making recommendations for improvement. After completing the annual evaluation, each committee assembles a report detailing the data obtained and reflecting upon the program's effectiveness in terms of how well students are achieving the outcomes under investigation, and indicating areas for improvement. The information and reflection is used for improving assignments, course design, and instruction to better achieve learning outcomes, as well as to refine outcome statements and course objectives.

The charts below document the results of these assessments. Unfilled cells denote outcomes/goals scheduled to be assessed in future years.
